Geography is a new Topic introduced in Year 1.

We begin with the basic skills of investigating places.

After investigating the local environment (school) Grimsby in Autumn we move on to looking and learning about the 4 countries of the UK (With a focus on Lincoln, England) in Spring term.



Human & physical features of Lincoln:

Ask and answer geographical questions (such as what is this place like? What or who will I see in this place? What do people do in this place?)
Identify land use.

Identify the key features of a location in order to say whether it is a city, town, village or costal area.

Use aerial images and plan perspectives to recognise the landmarks and basic ph
