

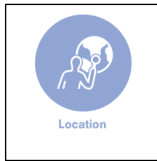
Neil Armstrong/Tim Peake

Quick Summary

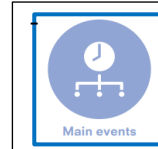


SUMMARY

The topic will begin by children exploring what an astronaut is, what they wear in space – focusing on the spacesuit and why it has been designed in that way. This key knowledge will then help children to understand who Neil Armstrong and Tim Peake are and their significance. Important historical events will be covered (The Moon Landing in 1969 and Tim Peake being in the International Space Station) and they will be explored so that children understand the differences between them. Children will be given opportunities to place key events on a timeline, showing events that have happened recently and events that happened a long time ago.

Main events

1930 – Neil Armstrong is born. 1946 – Learns to become a pilot. 1949 – Neil goes to war. 1952 – Neil joins NASA. 1969 Neil is the first astronaut to land on the moon. 1971 – Neil leaves NASA to become a teacher. 2012 – Neil Armstrong dies.



Travel and exploration

On July 20, 1969, some 600 million television viewers watched the Apollo 11 Moon landing. Neil Armstrong stepped onto the lunar soil and said, "That's one small step for [a] man, one giant leap for mankind." He and crewmate Buzz Aldrin departed after over 21 hours of scientific tests and sample collection on the Moon.

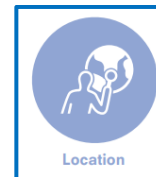
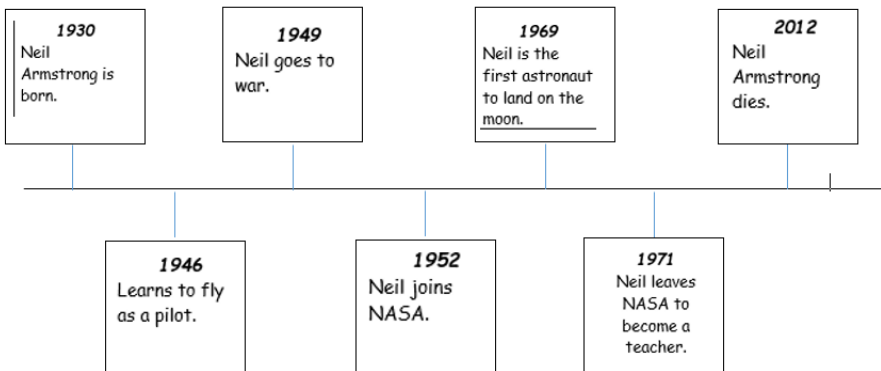
Neil Armstrong is famous for being **the first person to set foot on the Moon**. He was a part of the Apollo 11 spaceflight alongside Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins. Apollo 11's success in 1969 opened a new era of space exploration.

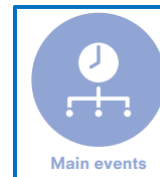
